### Why Holy Week is Important

Why does religion exist? Because we need.

If we didn't need anything, if we were content all the time, we would have no need for religion. One thing would be as good as another; we would simply exist in a state of eternal okay-ness. But we are not okay. We sense that we are not living up to our potential. Worse, we are painfully aware of our *inability* to fulfill our potential. We are limited by weakness, isolation, ignorance, disease, and finally death. Death is our ultimate limit, a genetic deadline that gives us just so much time and no more. In the words of author Neil Gaiman, "Every hour wounds. The last one kills."

To be free from death means to be free to fulfill our potential, to have the possibility of becoming what we were meant to be, to return to the Edenic existence in which we lived rightly – in harmony with nature, ourselves, and our God. This is why Holy Week is so important. It represents our liberation from death into the fulness of life.

Christ and God are one. Therefore, Christ's abandonment, suffering, and death on the cross means that God has embraced abandonment, suffering, and death as well. *God reigns over suffering and death as well as joy and life*. In the presence of God, *all* things are redeemed, restored, and blessed. Christ on the cross means that even suffering and death are now blessed. And if death is blessed, what is there left for us to fear? As St. Paul wrote, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? … For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

#### Unapproved February 26, 2024 Council Minutes

Present: Jerry Young Jerry DePalmo, Mary Billy, John Grangaard, Sally Fink, Jim Rengert, Pastor Martin. Excused: Greta Blegvad, Sadie Smith.

Invocation led by Jerry Young.

Old business: discussion of congregation responses to survey. Suggested rummage sales, meals, or events. Many people checked all of the suggestions except for evangelism. It was suggested that we have a temple talk from a representative of Coalition of Care to explain what they do and it was also suggested that perhaps we consider four community events per calendar year.

January Secretary's Report was accepted by Council – 1<sup>st</sup> Sally Finck, 2<sup>nd</sup> Mary Billy.

Reports were received from Congregational Care, Property and Rental Property.

Congregational Care – all shut-ins were visited either in person or by phone and greeting cards were sent.

Property - new stonework will be completed at the front of the church when the weather is warmer. They will make sure not to do the repairs during Holy Week.

Rental property: work continues at the Hudson Ave. property. It is anticipated

that a total of \$15,000 will be spent to rehab the property to get it ready for rental.

A motion was made by Mary Billy and seconded by Pastor Martin to accept reports as given. Motion passed.

The financial secretary reported that we nearly broke even in the month of January with an income of \$23,471.70 and expenses of \$23,477.18. Jerry DePalmo moved that the treasurer's report be accepted the motion carried.

Pastor's report: made some basic repairs around the church including repairing a water leak in the lady's restroom. Licking Memorial has asked if they could hold a yoga class here in the church on Monday and Friday mornings at 9:00 AM. Council gave permission for them to see if our space would work for them. Fred Freytag contacted the pastor about a 2025 visit from our Mecklenburg partners. They are thinking between August 1st and August 10th of 2025. Council asked pastor to tell Fred that those dates seemed fine. Pastor recommended we look at leasing a larger copier as our copy requirements have increased. Mary Billy made the motion Jerry DePalmo seconded and the motion passed.

Meeting was adjourned with prayer led by pastor.


