CONGREGATION VOTE - There will be an affirming congregation vote regarding the replacement of the church sign on the <u>weekend of July 5th and 6th</u>. The church sign has been out of service since the roundabout construction began. Funds were secured from the city to cover the repair or replacement of the current sign prior to the roundabout construction. We have found a company that can install a modern lighted sign within the current stone structure. Total cost will be \$8,452, which is well under the total funds we have set aside for this project. The sign is anticipated to be completed by the end of the summer.


