Property Committee: completed work on paint and plastering repair in the main church and are very pleased with the work. They are working on a new parking lot contract with the school showing a \$500 increase per year for next three years. This reflects the additional use of the parking lot by intermural events and busses driving across the lot. Contract has been sent to the district.

Congregational Care: all shut-ins visited, Easter cards sent. President report: none.


