How God Works

I've been a pastor for almost thirty years, and I still don't know how God works. I know how to pick hymns, organize a committee, plan worship, visit the sick, and write a sermon. But tell you how God works? Nope.

Part of the problem is the word *works*. It makes God sound like a can opener or a bicycle. I'm actually pretty good at bicycles; I can usually find the source of that wobble or grinding noise pretty quickly and fix it too. Same for clocks, mowers, power tools and what have you. If it is mechanical, I can usually figure it out. But God isn't mechanical and, in the words of Monty Python, "is SO big, so absolutely huge." that I find God impossible to comprehend.

Our lives are becoming more and more unpredictable. Our government is being shredded, and the future looks stormy. What is going to happen? I don't know. I would make a terrible politician, and probably an even worse sociologist. I never thought things would come to this, so I certainly wouldn't trust me to predict the future. I can't tell what is going to happen any better than I can tell you what God might do about it. But I can tell you, based on what God has done and said in the past, what God is *likely* to do in the future. God has shown a consistent preference for the poor and vulnerable (Exodus 22:20-26). The prophets repeatedly remind us that God has little patience with tyrants who shove and bully and abuse their power (Ezekiel 34:20-22). God delivered slaves into freedom (Deuteronomy 26:5-8), raised a shepherd to be king (Psalm 78:70-72), provided mana for the starving (Exodus 16:1-5), drink for the thirsty (Exodus 17:1-7), healed lepers (Matthew 8:1-4), and gave hope to the despised (John 4:21-26). But that

same God crushed tyrants, humbled the proud, and sent the rich away hungry and befuddled.

I don't know what is going to happen, but as God's people have always done in dangerous times, I will pray and look to my God. But *while* I'm praying and waiting for God to act, I plan to act out a bit myself. I may not be able to crush tyrants, but I can be a burr in the saddle. After all, God may choose to use me in the grand scheme of things. Who knows?


