## Do Not Judge...

*“Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.*

*“Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother’s eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, ‘Let me take the speck out of your eye,’ when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother’s eye.”*  
(Matthew 7:1-5)

In the first half of 2025, “politically motivated” attacks have almost doubled from the same period in 2024. I say “politically motivated” because motivations in such attacks are often complex and hard to pin down. When such attacks occur, often our first thought is to hope it wasn’t perpetrated by someone representing our own party or views. Our second thought is too often the unspoken, but no less shameful, question of whether perhaps they had it coming to them.

The recent murder of right-wing political activist Charlie Kirk kicked up a whirlwind of such questions. As information trickled in, right and left leaning commentators scrambled to link accused killer Tyler Robinson to their opponents while exonerating themselves, and cast Kirk and Robinson as either saints or demons. Doing so allowed “us” to distance ourselves from “them” and keep our hands clean while asking about the state of our country.

But *we* are our country. We harbor the same angers, resentments, and bigotry that, given the right circumstances, could lead to the same tragic

outcomes. We have become enthusiastic spectators of the lurid game of partisan politics, fueling the spectacle with our clicks and tweets while cheering on the loudest and most provocative. We have allowed hate speech, lies, and violence to become so normalized, and guns so available, that violence becomes more a matter of when than if.

Jesus was not in the habit of blaming others. He rather encouraged his followers to look within and recognize their own brokenness and guilt as a deterrent to their (and our) pronounced preference for pointing out that same brokenness and guilt in others. He called “us” to recognize those “others” as part of a common humanity whose job it is not to convict but to forgive each other.

As the old bumper sticker said, “When Jesus said ‘love your enemies,’ I think He probably meant don’t kill them.” He did, and He does, no matter what they may have said or done. I will continue to pray for the souls of both Charlie Kirk and Tyler Robinson for the simple reason that our souls are the same – equally marred and equally precious.

### **Notes to the Church and Congregation:**

**COMMUNITY DROP IN CENTER – AN OPPORTUNITY** Over the past few months, the leadership of St. Paul's has been in conversation with that of Holy Trinity, exploring the possibility of cooperating in ministry to the growing unhoused population in Newark. Holy Trinity currently provides a weekday Drop-In ministry offering meals, clothing, phone charging, a social setting, and occasional health care. They also offer a Warming Center for winter nights when

temperatures drop to dangerous levels.

We see an opportunity for cooperation in that these ministries are quickly outgrowing the available space at Holy Trinity, and St. Paul's currently has a large amount of well-suited unused space. St. Paul's downtown location makes us an ideal site. The Drop-In Center, open from 9:30am-4pm, Monday-Friday, would make use of Danford Hall, the kitchen, main floor bathrooms, and the library (for use as a food bank). The nighttime Warming Center, activated only when the temperature drops to 10 degrees or lower, would house women and families in the upstairs education rooms, and men in Danford Hall.

Holy Trinity's current operation of these programs has been supported by a countywide network of volunteers, donations, and grants, and this support would also be applied to any efforts at St. Paul's.

After exploring the possibilities, our two councils now feel ready to bring this to our respective congregations for consideration and input. In the coming weeks you will be hearing more with opportunities to ask questions and discuss.

## **Unapproved Congregation Council Minutes Sept. 22, 2025**

Jerry Young opened the meeting with prayer.

Picnic – September 28<sup>th</sup>. Start grill sooner. Plan on indoor dinner on October 19<sup>th</sup> same menu. Discussion about continuing every month. Will revisit after the holidays.

Property – Sign is now scheduled to be installed at the end of October. Some difficulty getting accurate measurements due to the current state of the sign. RR fans are okay, the lights just need to be on in the hallway next to them. Potholes fixed in parking lot. WELCA paid for restroom refurbishing. Greta made motion to approve, Sally seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Minutes from August meeting - Martin made motion to approve, John seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's – General Fund below \$6,000. Kerrill requested to move \$20,000 undesignated savings to GF to cover expenses. Sally made motion to approve, Greta seconded, motion passed unanimously. Deficit sits at 48% of expected at the end of August, giving for the month was \$200 over \$13,000 budget, but expenses were \$10,000 over income. Jim made motion to approve, Martin seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Rental – Julie Hippen needs help to get piano into 105. Jim will arrange for truck and ask for help for October 5<sup>th</sup>. Locks also need rekeyed. Referring this to Encore. 1013 front complaining of critters in ceiling to both Jim and Encore but refuses to use remedies provided. Referred back to Encore and Jim encouraged to let the management company handle rather than being in the middle. Martin made motion to approve, John seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Pastor's – Catechism moved to Weisgerber Lounge on Sept 25<sup>th</sup> due to response being better than expected – (cool to need more room!) Pothole repaired at no charge by company redoing school asphalt. It is uncertain if Fallers can continue into 2026. Sally made motion to approve, Greta seconded, motion passed unanimously.


