Back in September, our congregation took part in *God's Work, Our Hands*. My original intent had been to celebrate the collected projects as part of worship the following week. At the time, I had only received two or three reports and frankly didn't want to draw attention to what I feared had proven a mediocre response. Since that time, however, reports have slowly trickled in, providing a glimpse into the Godly work being done daily by our congregation. Modesty and discretion have lead me to omit names and certain identifying details.

Some projects were ambitious: rebuilding the sacristy steps, taking down a tree threatening a neighbor's property, building an elevated deck for a growing family.

Some projects were community-minded: picking up trash, putting together school-kits for underserved children, distributing gift cards and other needed items to the homeless.

Some projects were more personal: visiting or cooking for sick or isolated neighbors, or simply taking the time to spend in private devotion and prayer.

As we approach Thanksgiving, it is clear we have much to give thanks for! The projects reported were as varied the those reporting them, demonstrating creativity, generosity, and a powerful sense of community. The Spirit still blows through human hearts, kindling dormant embers into fires of faith and service. And the best part is many of the reported projects, far from special efforts, seemed to be business as usual – the simple and magnificent daily work of compassionate, generous souls in the world.

The Kingdom of God will not come with the sound of trumpets and clash of arms. It will come one small, quiet act of kindness at a time. Thank you for participating in *God's Work, Our Hands*. I am proud to be part of this community!

Things to note about the 2024 Budget:

The pastor's salary reflects at 6.3% increase as mandated by the synod. This has been apportioned between the base salary and housing allowance. Medical costs have decreased as the Pastor's primary carrier is now Medicare. The church provides continuing spousal health care, 12% pension, as well as disability and life insurance. The allowance amount has remained constant.

Staff Salaries - The church secretary shows an increase from \$10.75 to \$11.50 per hour. Organist increases to \$16,000 and the Choir director to \$8,500 as mandated by his contract. No hourly increase has been budgeted for the sextons although the budget has been adjusted to reflect the 20 hours per week rather than the 15 in 2023.

Church Facilities has been adjusted to \$36,500 to reflect increasing facility costs.

Income Based on the last few recent months, offerings were calculated at \$13,000 a month. Interest income not adjusted due to market volatility. Rental property return was left at \$20,000 to be conservative.

The expected deficit is \$ 66,806. In 2024 we will need to use savings to cover the deficit amount should it be as large as calculated. This was discussed when we prepared to call a full-time pastor, so the deficit is not unexpected, but cannot continue indefinitely.


