Notes to the Church and Congregation:

CONGREGATION MEETING AND VOTE There will be a congregation meeting and vote to approve the repaving of the church parking lot off Locust Street. St. Paul's Property Committee recommends that we contract to repair and resurface the church parking lot for a total cost of not more than \$68,000. The last time the lot was repaired was in the early 2000's. The Licking County Board of Education, which operates the Phoenix School on Church Street and uses our lot, has agreed to contribute \$22,000 toward the project as well as pay St. Paul's an annual rent of \$4,500 moving forward. The remaining funds will be from the Ponser Designated Property Fund and any donations from the congregation. **The Congregation vote will be held after the services on the weekend of July 8th and 9th.**




