Small Stars

At the time of writing, the current administration has narrowly passed a giant omnibus bill likely to result in millions losing their healthcare, a further widening of the already yawning economic gulf between rich and poor, and a ballooning national debt. Just another Tuesday in Washington. For those paying attention to such things, it is easy to feel discouraged, especially if you are one who already struggles to find affordable housing or healthcare. Compassion for the needs of the poor, the sick, the foreigner, at least on a national level, seems on the ropes. But when the brighter lights of hope grow dim, one can still find more modest stars by which to find the way. Indeed, the darker the night, the brighter such stars seem to shine.

- *When rain threatened to soak a friend's possessions on moving day, painters, hired by the rental company, put down their brushes and pitched in as movers to beat the approaching storm.*
- *Seeing the increase in Newark's homeless population, a small congregation makes the bold choice to express their worship through service, removing church pews to make room for sleeping cots.*
- *Having received support during a difficult time, a congregation member becomes a postage stamp warrior, sending out hundreds of cards each year to ensure no one feels overlooked or forgotten.*
- *Another congregation member simply decides to treat everyone as a friend and is not surprised when she discovers they are.*

None of these will be in tomorrow's headlines; such moments seldom draw much notice from anyone except the recipients of such kindness. But the one whose vigilant eye noticed the lily's divine raiment, a sparrow's final flight, and the widow's single copper coin sees such moments of compassion and remembers. These intimate acts of kindness and those who perform them remind us there is still kindness to be found for those who have eyes to see. As long as we feed the flame of kindness it will not go out, even in the darkest night.


